

Winterize your Vehicle Checklist

Winter can be a harsh season, especially if you live in an area with extreme weather conditions. Here is a checklist of 10 things you can do to prepare your vehicle for winter:

Tires: Check for proper inflation (pressure drops in cold weather), adequate tread depth (4/32-inch is recommended for winter), and the benefits of switching to snow tires.
Battery: Test its strength, inspect terminals for corrosion, and consider replacing batteries that are more than three years old.
Fluids: Ensure all fluids, especially windshield washer fluid and coolant, are rated for freezing temperatures. Also, mention the benefits of using a thinner, winter-grade oil.
Wipers and Visibility: Replace worn-out wiper blades, fill up with de-icing fluid, and ensure all lights are clean and working.
Heating and Defrost: Verify that the heater and front and rear defrosters are working correctly for safety and comfort.
Emergency Kit: Provide a list of must-have items, including jumper cables, , blankets, and traction aids like sand.
Undercarriage Care: Discuss the importance of washing away corrosive road salt, especially from the undercarriage, to prevent rust.
Brakes: Advise a brake inspection for optimal stopping power on slippery roads.
